The master list, ranked. 72 engines, apps and tracked mechanisms in one order — and the order moves when the priorities do.

THE METHOD

One list, five weights

Every item carries five scores. Move the weights and all 72 re-rank live. The ranking is not an opinion — it is a set of weights anyone in the room can move.

Revenue ceiling	Scale of the addressable market, straight from the master list
Build readiness	Build Now, Most Helpful, Back Burner
IP protection	Copyrighted, patent-pending tier, or not yet filed
WidePoint fit	Overlap with the PKI, telecom and federal business
Mission impact	What changes if it runs

Five orders from one list

- Revenue ceiling — biggest markets first
- Build Now first — shortest path to shipped
- WidePoint fit — closest to your existing stack
- IP protected first — filed before unfiled
- Mission first — clinical, veteran, trafficking

Whichever order you want, say it and the list is that order.

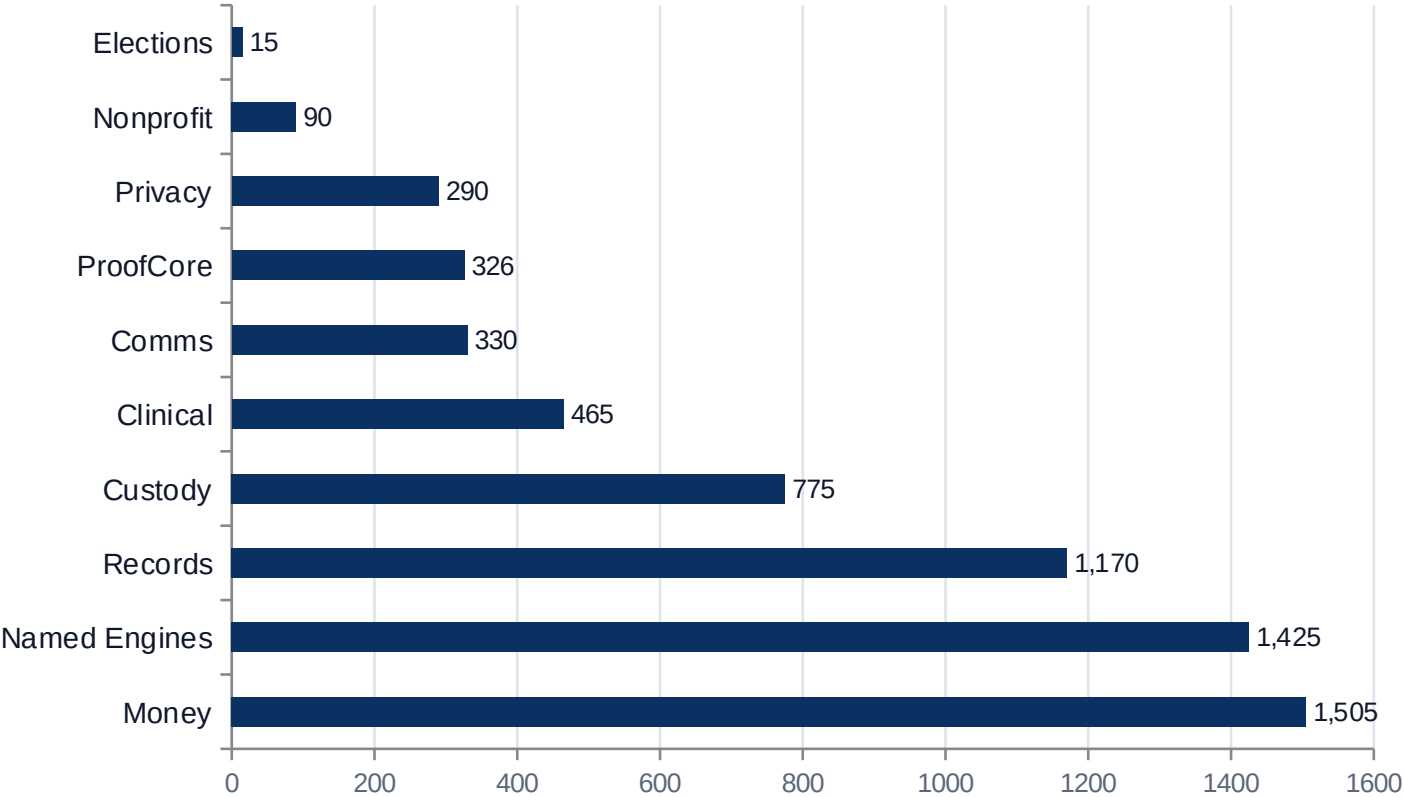
Seventy-two items, ten groups

Seven technical families, plus the ProofCore ecosystem and the Nonprofit Accountability track.

72 ITEMS RANKED Named engines, applied mechanisms, and the app verticals built on them.	\$2.0B-\$4.5B STATED CEILING / YR The binder figure. 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Ceiling by family

Two families — Money and the Named Engines — carry nearly half the portfolio ceiling between them.



Reading the chart

Elections looks small because its six mechanisms are priced inside Vote Verification and Safe Elections, not sold standalone.

ProofCore is sixteen items with a low ceiling each — volume, not scale.

Comms is the smallest family with the highest fit: three OEM primitives that drop straight into a PKI stack.

HOW THE LIST SPLITS

Tier and priority

Tier is revenue scale. Priority is build order. They are two different questions and the list carries both.

Tier	Items	Ceiling range	What the tier means
Tier 1	27	\$1.71B – \$4.91B	Federal, state, DoD scale, or direct overlap with the PKI, identity and telecom business
Tier 2	22	\$360M – \$985M	Enterprise and institutional: hospital systems, large nonprofits, cybersecurity buyers
Tier 3	17	\$166M – \$443M	Vertical SaaS and civic tech: newsrooms, nonprofits, smaller agencies
Tier 4	5	\$19M – \$58M	Emerging and mission-driven: longer sales cycle, grant or pilot funded

IP posture sets the order

Copyright protects the written work and the source code. It does not protect the mechanisms. Those need the provisional filing, and the twelve-month public-disclosure clock is already running.

Nothing goes into a technical review before the filing that protects it.

A STARTING SEQUENCE, OPEN FOR DISCUSSION

What integrates first

Dependency and fit decide the order, not size. Nothing moves before the core it runs on.

FIRST

Blindfold Engine

The cryptographic core. Merkle bulletin board, signed tree heads, inclusion and consistency proofs, dual control. Nearly every other engine sits on it.

SECOND

The Comms family

Compartmented Delivery · One-Way Derivation · Zero-Knowledge Observer. Three OEM primitives, the purest overlap with an existing PKI stack. \$110M – \$330M combined ceiling.

THIRD

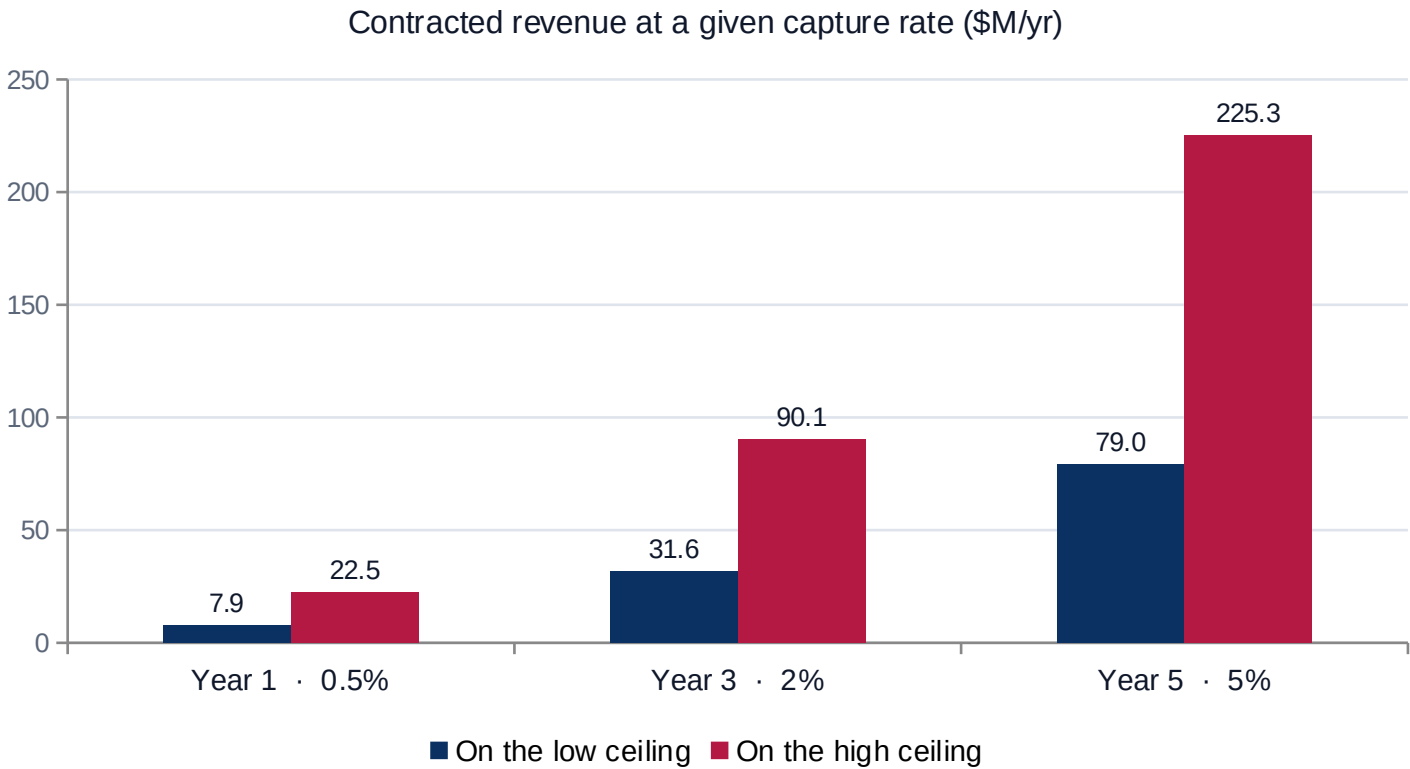
Money and telecom fraud

Standing Business Token closes the STIR/SHAKEN gap; Rotating Credentials sells alongside an IAM line; Wire Routing Check is a per-transaction fee.

Everything after that follows the weighting the room chooses — revenue ceiling, readiness, fit, or mission.

What a small share is actually worth

A ceiling is the whole market. Capture is the part won. Modelled on the 25 Tier-1 Build Now items only.



The honest version

No per-item financial history exists yet. Every ceiling is TAM math, shown so it can be argued with rather than guessed at.

Half of one percent of this base is still an eight-figure business in year one.

The capture rates are inputs, not claims. Change them in the workbook and every figure follows.

WHAT LEAVES THIS ROOM

Whatever order you choose, it exports before you leave.

- The ranked list, in whatever weighting is agreed, as a spreadsheet
- The Build Now pack — the Tier-1 subset with ceilings, models and IP status
- The revenue workbook, with the capture rates set to yours rather than mine

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
